Construction Coming Soon

Much needed parking will be added to the library this spring. An additional 18 parking spaces with sidewalks will be added along the north and east sides of the library yard. We apologize for any inconvenience this will cause.

2022 saw the construction of a shelter house on the library lawn to use with our many outdoor programs. Due to the tremendous community support of the project, the shelter was funded at 94% of it's total cost.

This support has allowed us to move forward with our parking project. New carpeting will also be installed within the next few years.

Our library board, director and fiscal officer continuously strive to allocate library funds to best serve our community's needs both through the services and materials we offer and the maintenance of our building and grounds.
